Unfortunately, human pride and rebellion (the essence of sin) broke those harmonious relationships (Gen Ch 3), and the rest of the Bible is the story of God's gracious act of redemption, ultimately in Christ, culminating in the new heavens and earth where, once again we are in perfect communion with God, each other, and the new creation. But we are not there yet! Pentecost marks a significant milestone on the way to that end – the creation of a new community of broken, but redeemed people in fellowship with God and one another.
