Boldness!

The Book of Acts records for us the amazing transformation of the Jesus' disciples. The cowering and fearful witnesses of Jesus' crucifixion became bold witnesses of the risen Lord, fearlessly proclaiming the good news that Jesus is alive and He is Lord! In the face of opposition from civil and religious authorities, we see the early Church openly sharing the Gospel, empowered by the Spirit with boldness.

But it wasn't just boldness in evangelism. There was a boldness in prayer (see Acts 4:23 – 31) as they praised God for what they had experienced, and asked God to reveal the truth to those to whom they witnessed!

Boldness should not be confused with arrogance. There is no room for self-righteousness or personal boasting in the Christian faith. The disciples were acutely aware that their new relationship with God was a result of God's gracious gift in Christ Jesus, nothing that they could boast of. This boldness is reflected in that great hymn by Charles Wesley (possibly my favourite) "And can it be .." .That same humble boldness that comes from a heart grateful to God for His mercy. Lord, by your Holy Spirit, grant me boldness that comes from a grateful heart, to bear witness to your goodness to all I come in contact with. Ian Weeks

Because of Pentecost, We Have A New Boldness Acts 4

One of the effects of the Day of Pentecost was to empower the followers of Jesus with a new boldness – a boldness to fearlessly proclaim that Jesus is not only alive, but also is the Messiah who is worthy of our complete trust and surrender. They called people to repent and to submit to the Lordship of Jesus, and suffered persecution and oppression as a result. But this did not deter them!

Pray: Lord, as with boldness did the early Church proclaim the good news, may we also have boldness to trust you completely, speak about you graciously, and follow Jesus faithfully. In Jesus' name, Amen.

1. A New Boldness In Word and Deed Read: Acts 4:1 – 21

By the power of the Holy Spirit, the disciples continued the ministry of Jesus – proclaiming the arrival of the Kingdom of God in the Risen Christ with great signs and wonders, calling people to repentance and faith, and ministering to the sick and demon possessed. Theses previously fearful disciples were transformed by the Holy Spirit into bold witnesses to the saving power of the Gospel.

When confronted by the religious authorities, they could not contain their urge to tell of who Jesus is and what God had done by Him. They confessed before the rulers and elders that Jesus alone is Lord and that salvation is found in no-one else (v 12). What boldness!!

Reflection: What stops me from being bold in my witness to Jesus?
How might we be perceived as arrogant as we proclaim the gospel to the world around us? How might we refute such a suggestion?

2. A New Boldness In Prayer

Read Acts 4:23 – 31

When Peter and John returned to the gathering of the Church, they recounted their experience. This caused the Church to pray. Their prayer was not for their comfort or deliverance from opposition. Rather, they prayed that God would continue to use them to share the good news about Jesus regardless of the reactions of the world around them. Their prayer acknowledged that the message of Jesus will be unpopular and bring opposition. So they prayed for more boldness to continue to proclaim the Gospel.

Reflection: What impresses you about the prayer in this passage?

What comfort or confidence do you draw from this prayer? What does it prompt you to pray for in this current age?

Challenge: Identify three people that you think you might be able to have a conversation about Jesus with.

Pray for them – that they might be receptive.

Pray for yourself – that you might be alert to the opportunities and

bold in those opportunities.

Evangelism = sharing the good news about Jesus in the power of the Holy Spirit, and leaving the results to God!
