July Sermon Series: Hear the Word of the Lord! A Word that Comforts Isaiah 40:1 – 11

Chapters 1 – 39 of Isaiah paint a sad picture of the unfaithfulness of God's people in the southern Kingdom of Judah, and the dire consequences of their idolatry, rebellion, spiritual adultery, and unwillingness to trust God.

Isaiah warns them of the impending judgement of God upon them, and the resulting looming siege by the Assyrian army and their northern allies, and the subsequent Babylonian invasion.

Scattered throughout these chapters are messages of hope and the possibility of rescue because God's faithfulness to His Covenant with His people – messages that are mostly ignored – and consequently the Babylonians arrive with devastating effect – death, destruction, exile.

However, all is not lost – Isaiah 40 is a major turning point, as Isaiah conveys to the people the real hope of Divine Comfort in the midst of tragedy and despair: Hear the Word of the Lord – a Word that Comforts!

Where does hope come from when despair seems to be overwhelming? In the midst of our despair - whether as a result our fault or the fault of others, we can find comfort in the Word of God:

1. The Source of Comfort – The Nature of God vv 1, 2

- * "My people" God has not disowned us
- * "Speak tenderly" God still cares for us
- * "she has received from the Lord" Grace abounds

2. The Substance of Comfort – Reconciliation with God v 2

- * "hard service completed" Punishment will not go on forever
- * "sin has been paid for" Forgiveness and reconciliation

3. The Voices of Comfort – Hear the Word of the Lord vv 3 – 11

- i) The Voice of Preparation get ready for the coming of God's glory
- * God's Word assures us that God is with us in our despair
- * Jesus = God with us!

ii) The Voice of Confidence - God's promises are firm

- * God's Word assures us that God is not frail like us & keeps His promises
- * The promises of God find their "Yes!" in Christ (2 Cor 1:20)

iii) The Voice of Celebration - The Good Shepherd has come!

- * God's Word assures us that there is Good News in bad times
- * The Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ = Good News of God's comfort

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God. (2 Cor 1:3, 4)
