AM Sermon Notes Daniel: Standing firm in a culture of compromise Daniel Ch 1 Standing firm in a foreign land.

The Babylonian invasion and subsequent exile of the people of Jerusalem in 587-586 BC would have to rank as one of the lowest points in the Bible story of God's people (see 2 Kings 24). Under God's judgement the people were subjected to the cruel reign of Nebuchadnezzar. The Temple was desecrated, and all of the royal court and civic leaders, including Daniel, were carted off into exile in Babylon. By the rivers of Babylon we sat and wept when we remembered Zion. How can we sing the songs of the Lord while in a foreign land? (Psalm 137:1, 4) Daniel finds himself in the court of this foreign King – how will he fare?
