The school has a Christian board to oversee it and many Christian teachers. Anne Weeks' friend Melinda Parker, who now lives in Sydney, is the Honorary Director & Anne helps out with administration.

Gyanankur's core values are:

PUNE, INDIA

- 1. Joy: School should be fun!
- 2. Service: not to be served, but to serve.
- 3. Transparency: lives and relationships marked by openness and honesty.
- 4. Dignity: everyone is treated with respect.

These are 4 counter-cultural values for India, where discrimination (based on one's colour or status), bribery & corruption are normal.

Since the Covid pandemic struck, the school has been closed but lessons and assemblies happen online. Despite all the challenges, all 42 Year 10 students passed their exams and graduated.

August Sermon Series: Judges - Light in a dark world

Throughout August we will be exploring the theme: *Light in a dark world* from the **OT book of Judges.** As you read through this book, I hope you will see the hand of God at work bringing light to a world darkened by calamity and human wickedness.

Pray: Heavenly Father, thank You that You sent Your Son to be the light of the world, a light that no darkness could overcome (John 1:5). As I reflect on the book of Judges, and the dark times of this world, may the light of Christ shine to show me the way. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Read: Judges 6:1 - 24 & 36 - 40

Reflect: Where's the mighty warrior?

1. We Need a Hero!

Judges 6 & 7

Ch 6:1 - 10

In desperate times, the world looks for heroes. We see this played out in the numerous "hero" movies – Batman, The Avengers, etc Unfortunately, these heroes are flawed characters, as we also see in the Book of Judges.

The peace after Deborah's influence (Judges 4 & 5) has faded. The cycle continues: the people rebel against God (Ch 6:1 & 7 - 10); and God exercises His Judgement upon them with the Midianites (Ch 6:1 - 6). The people of Israel needed a hero – they cried out to the Lord (v 6)

2. Step Up Mighty Warrior

Ch 6:11 - 16

God hears their cry and sends a (unnamed) prophet who pronounces God's judgement upon them (vv 7 - 10). But in His grace, He also visits an unsuspecting, and somewhat reluctant Gideon, who is given the task of delivering God's people from the oppressive Midianites (vv 11 - 14).

Gideon is a very unlikely hero – plagued by fear and doubt, he questions God's choice and throughout this chapter, his weakness - displayed in fear – becomes very evident, despite God's persistent reminder that He is with Gideon (vv 15 - 24).

3. We were expecting someone taller! Ch 6:17 – 40

Gideon's weakness is fear – fear of God's calling, fear of his family & community, and fear of the Midianites. He doubts himself and he doubts God. If we were looking for a hero, we might expect someone bigger, stronger, braver!

Gideon's first test is to demolish the family & community idols to the false god Baal, This he does at night out of fear of being caught (vv 25 – 27) To his credit, Gideon's father defends Gideon, and even issues Baal a challenge: if Baal is really a "god", then let Baal deal with Gideon himself!

In Judges 6 we find the famous episode of Gideon's fleeces – testing God's call and God's Word (vv 36 – 40). This is NOT a recommended model for seeking God's guidance! Gideon again does it out of fear and doubt – how many times does God need to say "I am with you, I will win the battle!!"??

5. The Battle Belongs to the Lord!

Ch 7

Finally Gideon prepares for battle & summons the army However, God knows the hearts of Gideon & the people, and Gideon is ordered to cull the army numbers so that it will be very clear that it is God who has delivered them, lest they boast (Ch 7:2)

In Ch 7, the battle is fought, but who did the fighting? In a twist of irony, we find that the Midianites bring themselves undone as they are thrown into confusion by a dream, and their imagination of a conquering army descending upon them (7:13-22), Gideon and his army finish them off, but it is very clear that it was God who rescued them.

6. Where's the Mighty Warrior?

In Gideon, like all human heroes, we see a very flawed character. But again, God in is His wisdom, grace and mercy uses the weak & fearful to accomplish His purposes. He is mightier than anything that may cause us to fear. In the darkness of our sin, and the sin of others, we need a mighty warrior to rescue us. As Paul reminds us: "Who will rescue me from this body of death?" (Rom 7:24, 25)

Praise God that he has sent us a "mighty warrior" in His Son the Lord Jesus. Again, as Paul wrote: 'Death has been swallowed up in victory.' 'Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?' The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Cor 15:54 – 57)

Pray: Heavenly Father, thank You that in Jesus I have a rescuer who is not weak, not unwilling, and able to deliver me. Help me to trust Your Word and Your promises as I look to Him for my deliverance. In Jesus' name. Amen.
