Open Doors was established in 1955 when Brother Andrew, a newly committed Christian, began smuggling Bibles into Eastern Europe. (*Read the story from the book God's Smuggler – available in the Church Library*)

Since then Open Doors has expanded to work in over 70 countries, providing Bibles, training and practical support to the persecuted church. Open Doors seeks to strengthen and prepare Christians living in persecution, and to mobilise the Australian church to identify with the global body of Christ.

Open Doors works through local partners and build long-term relationships in countries all around the world, with people who know and understand what is needed to see the church strengthened and the gospel proclaimed. The mission is to help the local church transform their nation for Jesus.

October Sermon Series: The Church Under Fire! #2 Confidence despite suffering.



Revelation 1:9 - 20

The Book of Revelation was written during an intense time of persecution and suffering for the 1st century Church. **The last remaining Apostle of Jesus, John**, was in exile on **Patmos**, a small Greek island in the Aegean Sea, as a result of anti-Christian persecution under the Roman emperor Domitian.

Pray: Heavenly Father, thank you that you have not left your Church without a message of hope. May the light and peace of Your Word encourage me today.

Read: Revelation 1:9 - 20

Reflect:

1. Last Man Standing!

Rev 1:9 - 11

Rev 1:12 – 20

In this time of persecution and suffering, John received visions and messages (revelations) from Jesus to pass on to the Christians in various places (and through them, the whole Church) who were experiencing the oppression of a wicked and brutal Empire – Rome. Through these revelations, John sought to encourage the Church to persevere with confidence in spite of their suffering.

John encourages them by:

* acknowledging their suffering - it was because of the Gospel

* acknowledging their fellowship in the Kingdom - he shares their pain

* reminding them that we have supernatural resources – patient endurance in Jesus

2. A Vision to Inspire Confidence

John is given an amazing vision of a man standing among some lampstands. It is apparent that it is a vision of Jesus, arrayed in glory.

In this vision we see that:

* there is a greater and more glorious Emperor than Domitian!

* King Jesus is alive! – the Romans could not destroy Him.

* King Jesus is more powerful than Domitian – He holds the keys to eternity

* King Jesus reigns in heaven, but He is also

with His people (the lampstands – we are the light of the world - Matt 5:14). * Jesus has a message for His Church – a message of hope in the midst of

persecution & suffering (as the Book of Revelation will convey).

* Jesus is in control!



3. Confidence Despite Suffering

The Book of Revelation reminds us that the Christian Church will always encounter opposition and antagonism if it is faithful to King Jesus.

Organizations such as *Open Doors* and T*he Barnabas Fund* alert us to the immense suffering and hardship many Christians endure in the world today – it is not just a 1st century phenomenon. There were more Christians killed for their faith is Jesus in the 20th century than all of the previous 19 centuries combined!

However, in spite of this harsh reality, we can endure persecution and suffering with confidence. Why? How?

Because Jesus' message to us via St John is that while suffering for the sake of the Gospel is real & perhaps inevitable, **however:**

* NO earthly power, Emperor or government is more powerful than Jesus

* Jesus is in control and will ultimately bring all earthly powers to account

* Jesus will ensure His people will come out of suffering into eternal glory

To him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood, and has made us to be a kingdom and priests to serve his God and Father – to him be glory and power forever and ever! Amen.


'Look, he is coming with the clouds,' and 'every eye will see him,
