Open Doors was established in 1955 when Brother Andrew, a newly committed Christian, began smuggling Bibles into Eastern Europe. (Read the story from the book God's Smuggler – available in the Church Library)

Since then Open Doors has expanded to work in over 70 countries, providing Bibles, training and practical support to the persecuted church. Open Doors seeks to strengthen and prepare Christians living in persecution, and to mobilise the Australian church to identify with the global body of Christ.

Open Doors works through local partners and build long-term relationships in countries all around the world, with people who know and understand what is needed to see the church strengthened and the gospel proclaimed. The mission is to help the local church transform their nation for Jesus.

Good News: Sunday Services to resume next Sunday 24th October 2021!!

Subject to Government mandates and Synod advice, the Church Council has determined that it is feasible for us to **resume physical Sunday Services next Sunday 24**th October.

As expected, there will be conditions and restrictions.

We must abide by the public health order which mandates:

- * compulsory masks & QR Code check-in
- * physical distancing 4 sq/metre
- * NO singing 🙁
- * sanitising of surfaces

Churches are exempted from prohibiting unvaccinated people from entering, so please be advised that there may be unvaccinated people present at Church.

On the advice of Synod, we will **not resume Morning Tea** until later in the year - probably December.

October Sermon Series: *The Church Under Fire!*#3 Strength to endure suffering Revelation 2:8 - 17

1. Seven Churches Under Fire Revelation 2:1 – 3:22

The messages John received in his visions were addressed to the "seven Churches" (1:11) in what is now the east coastal area of modern Turkey.

They were Churches experiencing severe persecution. Some of them are commended for their perseverance, while others are rebuked for their compromising weakness or failure to persevere.

What comfort can the Gospel give to these suffering Churches, and to Christians today who suffer persecution because of their faith in the Lord Jesus?

Pray: Heavenly Father, thank you that Your Word is truth, and a source of hope and comfort. Open my ears, my eyes, my mind and my heart to receive what you have for me this day. In Jesus' name. Amen.

Read: Revelation 2:8 - 17

Reflect:

2. Words of Comfort to Endure Suffering Revelation 2:8 – 17

- i) Smyrna: hear the Word of the Eternal King vv 8 11
 - * the One who is greater than any earthly ruler or power
 - * the One who has endured immense suffering, but is alive!
 - * the One who knows what they are going through

You will be tested — slandered, imprisoned, to the point of death BUT, it will not go on forever, so

- * be not afraid, be faithful and endure
- * anticipate glory & the crown of life
- ii) Pergamum: hear the Word of the One who speaks Truth vv 12 17
 - * He knows your situation and your challenges
 - * He knows you have been faithful
 - * He knows also your weaknesses and failings; yet forgives
 - * He will bring evil doers and heretics to account

So, repent, trust Him, overcome (persevere)

- * He will sustain you
- * He has your eternal destiny secured

3. Strength to Endure Suffering

From these messages to these two Churches (and the other 5) we should be able to take comfort and find strength to endure suffering, knowing that:


- * Jesus is Lord over all the powers & difficult circumstances
- * Jesus is with us in the midst of persecution and suffering
- * Jesus knows we are weak and frail, yet will not give up on us, offering forgiveness, hope, peace, comfort and eternal glory

* opposition to the Gospel will not go on forever, the coming King will bring all things to account and make all things right.

So Jesus says to us as well:

"Do not be afraid" (v 10); "Be faithful" (v 10); "I forgive" (v16); "I am with you and will come again for you" (v 16).

Pray: Thank you Lord that King Jesus is in control. Remind me of Your faithful presence whenever I feel anxious or afraid. Please strengthen Your Church to endure, with faithfulness, the challenges that beset us in this age, for Jesus' sake. Amen.
